BASTA Officially Submits Recall Petition Introduces Fundraising Video

Yesterday BASTA representatives submitted official recall petitions to the Bell City Clerk. Submitting the petition to the Bell city attorney is the last step necessary before signatures to certify the recall are gathered. In accordance with state law, Bell's city attorney has ten days to return the petition to BASTA. If the city attorney finds any discrepancies with the petition, the petitioner (BASTA) would then have the remainder of the ten days to return the petition "We're confident that we dotted all our I's and crossed all our T's, so the signature gathering process should begin in ten days," said BASTA representative Denisse Rodarte.

BASTA also announced the launch of two fundraising videos. The videos include BASTA members petitioning the general public for financial help for their recall and reform efforts. The first video of thirty-nine seconds is being spread virally through social networking postings on You Tube and Facebook. The second spot of thirty-seconds will run on southern California cable networks in the near future. "The story of the terrible abuse of public dollars has struck a national nerve. We believe there are many people of good will out there who are willing to donate to our cause, so we thought we'd talk to them," concluded Basta representative Marcos Oliva.
